1. Approval of Ordinance Granting a Map Amendment to Rezone the Property Located at 345 Sullivan Road from the O-R Office Research District to the B-2 General Business District

This item has gone before the Plan Commission and Public Hearing on September 3, 2019 with unanimous recommendation for approval. It was presented to the Village Board during Committee of the Whole on September 16, 2019. Motion for approval made by Trustee Carroll and seconded by Trustee Curtis. **Roll Call Vote:** Trustee Gaffino – yes, Trustee Lowery – yes, Trustee Curtis – yes, Trustee Martinez – yes, Trustee Carroll – yes. **Motion approved (5-0).**

2. Approval of Ordinance Granting a Special Use Pursuant to Title 17, Chapter 8 of the North Aurora Zoning Ordinance to Allow an Animal Hospital and Veterinary Clinic at 345 Sullivan Road

Motion for approval made by Trustee Curtis and seconded by Trustee Lowery. **Roll Call Vote:** Trustee Gaffino – yes, Trustee – Lowery - yes, Trustee Curtis – yes, Trustee Carroll – yes, Trustee Martinez – yes. **Motion approved (5-0)**.

3. Approval of Resolution for Route 31 TIF Façade Grant Funding to 313 and 315 South Lincolnway in the Amount of <u>\$2,369.27</u>

This was a supplemental request submitted to the Village Board for funds with the demolition of 313 and 315 South Lincolnway. They are requesting supplemental funds for the utility disconnection and well sealing on both properties.

Village Administrator Steve Bosco said that the applicant for the Fox Valley Park District permits, Jeff Palmquist, was at the meeting and able to speak, and also noted that the Village's Police Department has a reciprocal agreement with the Fox Valley Park District where the police department patrols park district properties. Motion for approval made by Trustee Curtis and seconded by Trustee Martinez. **Roll Call Vote**: Trustee Curtis – yes, Trustee Gaffino – yes, Trustee Lowery yes, Trustee Martinez – yes, Trustee Carroll – yes. **Motion approved (5-0)**.

6. Approval Ordinance Amending the North Aurora Code Section 5.08.350 to Increase the Number Of Class A – Large Restaurant Liquor Licenses Authorized in the Village Of North Aurora

A new business, Randall Café Bar and Grill, is coming to town at 360 and 362 North Randall Road and requesting a liquor license. Mayor Berman noted during discussion the size of the business as being smaller than a full scale restaurant. Village Administrator Bosco said the original building plan indicated about 35 seats and a small bar area. Motion for approval made by Trustee Curtis and seconded by Trustee Carroll. **Roll Call Vote**: Trustee Curtis – yes, Trustee Gaffino – yes, Trustee Lowery yes, Trustee Martinez – yes, Trustee Carroll – yes. **Motion approved (5-0)**.

VILLAGE OF NORTH AURORA COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 7, 2019

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Berman called the meeting to order.

ROLL CALL

DISCUSSION

1. Recreational Cannabis Businesses

Community & Economic Development Director Mike Toth addressed the board. In 2014, the North Aurora Village Board approved an ordinance to allow medical marijuana in all non-residential zoning districts as a permitted use and cultivation centers as a special use in I-2 districts. In 2014, there was a buffer that required medical cannabis dispensaries to be 1000 feet from schools, parks and day cares. That requirement has since been removed. Any dispensary that opened after July 1, 2019 was not subject to the 1000-foot buffer.

Toth stated that there will be five public meetings to discuss the topic of recreational sales of cannabis in the village. In August, the Committee of the Whole discussed this and was not in favor of onsite consumption of product. They did want to explore allowing cannabis businesses in the village and directed staff to solicit feedback from the Plan Commission. This happened on September 3rd. There were no comments from the public at that time. The focus was on the following 4 questions: Whether or not to limit the number of dispensaries, what zoning district would be appropriate, whether or not to allow them as a permitted or special use and whether or not to adopt setbacks.

Last week there was a Plan Commission formal public hearing. If the Village Board directs staff, it will move forward with final consideration on October 21st.

The Plan Commission, at their meeting, decided on a 1000-foot buffer on only the four public schools in North Aurora (Goodwin, Fearn, Schneider and Jewel). The Plan Commission also decided to memorialize in the ordinance, the 1500-foot separation buffer from other dispensaries.

There was a positive recommendation from the Plan Commission to allow recreational cannabis dispensaries in all non-residential districts as a special use. The miscellaneous uses, such as craft growers and infusing businesses would be advertised as a special use in the I-2 district.

Trustee Carroll asked why the village would allow dispensaries around parks and churches. Carroll said he wants the least amount of dispensaries in the village and would prefer none. Bosco noted that the Village Board is allowed to limit the number of dispensaries within the village. Trustee Curtis asked if the board could impose a set number of licenses for dispensaries, such as is done with liquor licenses. Bosco said that it would be a possibility. Curtis said she would like to have fewer rather than more dispensaries but noted that she was not against allowing a legally available product.

Mayor Berman said that what he has heard most from people is that they are against recreational use of marijuana. That is not the village's argument, however. It is a law that recreational cannabis will be legal and the village wants to control it in the best possible way. Mayor Berman said that the Plan Commission did a good job and spent a lot of time in discussions at both of their meetings.

Trustees Curtis and Gaffino said they were in favor of less dispensaries and a 1000-foot buffer and having a specific number of licenses available. The board was in favor of having a 1000-foot buffer around schools and churches.

Trustee Carroll said he was not in favor of the sale of recreational cannabis within the village and the crime that it will bring to the area. Carroll added his concern that there is currently no measurement of marijuana impairment. Carroll said he would rather have a recreational cannabis business open in another community instead of North Aurora. Carroll said that the private citizens are not in favor of this. Mayor Berman said that the board has not seen this concern in the open meetings which have been advertised. There have been only 3 people who have attended the open meetings. Mayor Berman said that whether someone buys marijuana in Batavia or Aurora, they will still be using in North Aurora. If it is being sold and used in North Aurora, the village should have control where it is being sold and how it is being consumed to the best of our ability.

The majority of the board agreed with the plan commission's findings and also decided to keep the 1000-foot buffer. Atty. Drendel said that when creating the zoning, will have to address the number of facilities. The board was in favor of 1 recreational cannabis dispensary at this time. Trustee Curtis asked if limiting to 1 dispensary would be an anti-trust issue. Atty. Drendel said that anti-trust would be between competitors and the Village is not in the competitive business of selling cannabis. Atty. Drendel said if the village limited to 1 dispensary, and someone pitched another, as with liquor licenses, the village could open it up to another. Carroll asked if we open it to 1, can we ever go backwards. Atty. Drendel said only if the business left. The village could not simply take it away from them. Toth noted if the village were to adopt the limitation of 1 facility in the zoning ordinance, the village could also amend the zoning ordinance to allow for more in the future. Atty. Drendel said that is correct.

Bosco asked the board if the consensus was to allow for one recreational cannabis facility along with the buffer requirements. Answer was yes. Bosco mentioned that he was not sure the village could license these businesses, but the village is limiting it to one and therefore do not need a license. Atty. Drendel said it is not like a liquor license where there is a local license. Bosco said the control would be the code where it states a limit of one.

2. Aurora Boundary Line Agreement Extension

The North Aurora/Aurora boundary line agreement was established in 1999 and set for a 20-year term. The current boundary agreement includes intergovernmental water agreement as well. It borders the Village of North Aurora to the south and eastern limits. The majority of the land is already incorporated into the village or respective city. The western portion of the village is what the village is focusing on in maintaining a boundary line agreement with Aurora. Staff is asking for an extension of the current agreement for one year. There are no changes. The City

of Aurora has expressed interest in the Marmion piece (on the west side of Hart Road). There are issues with storm water that is transpiring from the Marmion property to the residential properties to the west. The Village does not want to hand off a property and ignore an issue and therefore the village is working with the City of Aurora regarding this issue. The Board was in favor of a one year extension of the current agreement.

3. Southwest Fox Valley Cable Consortium Membership

There was discussion at the last meeting regarding doing the recording of the meetings in house. Three (3) Options:

- 1. Stay with the FVCC.
- 2. Village takes over duties: We will provide recording of the meetings and special events as needed.
- 3. Village takes over duties: We will provide recording of the meetings and special events as needed, and have a PEG channel.

Staff requested direction as to whether the Village would like to continue with the consortium or do the recordings in house. Bosco said that if the village were to stay with the consortium, there would be discussion regarding the proposed fee structure. If the board chooses an in-house option, would issue a 90-day notice and the village would have to continue funding the FVCC's operations for the rest of their fiscal year. They will have 90-days after the village's notice to decide if they want to continue. If they decide not to continue, the village is not sure it would get any of the assets that they have that is the village's proportional share at that time.

Trustee Curtis said this may have been a good idea at its conception but to spend \$50,000 a year to participate when technology and trends have changed and everyone is loading to YouTube and watching at their convenience, does not seem to make sense. The board was in favor of going with Option 2 at a cost of between \$7,000 - \$9,000/year. Mayor Berman was also in favor of Option 2.



An Ordinance amending Title 17 (Zoning) of the North Aurora Municipal Code pertaining to Adult-Use Cannabis

DISCUSSION

The Village Board discussed recreational cannabis businesses at their August 5, 2019 Committee of the Whole meeting. The Village Board indicated they were not interested in allowing on-site consumption of cannabis, but wanted to further explore the idea of allowing cannabis businesses in the Village. They concluded by directing staff to solicit input from the Plan Commission on the zoning aspects of cannabis businesses.

The Plan Commission discussed this item during a workshop session at their September 3, 2019 meeting. At that time, Plan Commission members were asked if they would want to limit the number of recreational cannabis dispensaries; if there is a particular zoning district appropriate for recreational cannabis dispensaries; if recreational cannabis dispensaries should be a permitted or special use; and if the Village should adopt setbacks from schools, parks, and day cares.

A public hearing was held on this item before the Plan Commission at their October 1, 2019 meeting. Based upon the Plan Commission's responses to the aforementioned questions, staff proposed six amendments to the Zoning Ordinance. The Plan Commission was in full agreement to allow Recreational Cannabis Dispensaries as a special use in all non-residential districts; allow Cannabis Craft Growers, Cannabis Infuser Organizations, Cannabis Processing Organizations, and Cannabis Transporting Organizations in the I-2 – General Industrial District as a special use; and restrict on-site consumption. Staff notes that the Plan Commission was clear during their workshop session that they did not want to restrict the number of dispensaries.

The Plan Commission was split on whether to require any buffering. Those Plan Commission members in favor of buffering implied potential negative impacts of such use in proximity to school, parks and daycares. Those against any buffering believed that the 1,500 separation between dispensaries would limit the number of dispensaries and the special use process provides the Village with adequate oversight. The Plan Commission did get a positive vote to establish a 1,000 foot buffer for Recreational Cannabis Dispensaries specifically from the perimeter of Fearn Elementary School, Goodwin Elementary School, Schneider Elementary School, and Jewel Middle School. The Plan Commission also voted to memorialize the state requirement prohibiting Recreational Cannabis Dispensaries from being located within 1,500 feet of the property line of a pre-existing dispensing organization.

- 5) Title 17.11.2 to establish buffer requirements for Recreational Cannabis Dispensaries from the perimeter of school grounds, a playground, a recreation center or facility, a child care center, a public park or public library, or a game arcade to which admission is not restricted to persons 21 years of age or older.
- 6) Title 17.11.2 to prohibit on-site consumption of cannabis as part of any permitted or conditional use.

BACKGROUND

On June 25th, 2019, Governor J.B. Pritzker signed the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, Illinois House Bill 1438, into law. This law makes cannabis (marijuana) legal to sell throughout the State of Illinois. Adults 21 and over will be allowed to purchase, possess, and consume cannabis. The bill will go into effect on January 1st, 2020, and addresses many different aspects of cannabis.

The Village will have the choice to prohibit or significantly limit the location of a cannabis business within its jurisdiction by ordinance. Zoning will be needed for cultivation centers, craft growers, infusers, processors, transportation organizations and

dispensaries. The Village also has authority to determine if consumption of cannabis can be allowed on premise at dispensaries.

From a zoning perspective, the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act provides local authority the ability to:

- Opt out of allowing cannabis businesses
 - Can allow recreational cannabis of certain businesses while prohibiting others
- Enact zoning ordinances and regulations designating the time, place, and manner; examples include:
 - Predefining the number of establishments
 - Limiting the location of cannabis businesses by:
 - Zoning district
 - Adopting setbacks (i.e. buffers) from schools, parks, day cares, etc.
 - Requiring a minimum distance between establishments
 - Classifying use as permitted or special use in various zoning districts
 - Reasonably limiting hours of operation
 - Prohibiting on-site consumption

For reference purposes, the Village allows medical cannabis dispensaries in all business, office and industrial districts as a permitted use and cannabis cultivation centers as a special use in the I-2 General Industrial District.

The Village Board discussed recreational cannabis businesses at their August 5, 2019 Committee of the Whole meeting. While the Village Board indicated they were not interested in allowing the miscellaneous cannabis businesses (craft growers, infusers, processors, transportation organizations) and on-site consumption of cannabis, they wanted to further explore the idea of allowing recreational cannabis dispensaries and directed staff to solicit input from the Plan Commission.

The Plan Commission discussed this item during a workshop session at their September 3, 2019 meeting. At that time, Plan Commission members were asked whether they would want to limit the number of recreational cannabis dispensaries; if there is a particular zoning district appropriate for recreational cannabis dispensaries; whether recreational cannabis dispensaries should be a permitted or special use; and whether the Village should adopt setbacks for setbacks from schools, parks, and day cares. The following is a general summation of the Plan Commission's feedback:

Limit the number of recreational cannabis dispensaries

While some Plan Commission members commented that there should be a limit on the number of recreational cannabis dispensaries, many believed that the number of recreational cannabis dispensaries should not be capped.

Outcome – the proposed text amendments do not include a limitation on the number of recreational cannabis dispensaries.

Particular zoning district appropriate for recreational cannabis dispensaries

The Plan Commission was seemingly supportive of allowing recreational cannabis dispensaries in all non-residential zoning districts, similar to that of medical cannabis dispensaries.

Outcome – recreational cannabis dispensaries are being proposed in all non-residential zoning districts.

Whether recreational cannabis dispensaries should be a permitted or special use The Plan Commission debated on whether or not to allow recreational cannabis dispensaries as a permitted use with specifically adopted use standards or allow it as a special use. The Plan Commission concluded that recreational cannabis dispensaries should be a special use to allow the Village to regulate the use on a per-lot basis.

Outcome – recreational cannabis dispensaries are being proposed as a special use in all non-residential zoning districts.

Whether the Village should adopt setbacks for setbacks from schools, parks, and day cares


Staff presented a buffer map to the Plan Commission, which included a 1,000 foot setback from existing schools, parks, and day cares. The 1,000 foot setback required of medical cannabis dispensaries and the advertisement of cannabis products was used as the basis for the 1,000 foot buffer. Staff notes that the medical dispensary setback was removed by the state and is no longer required for establishments that opened after July 1, 2019.

Outcome – a 1,000 foot buffer is being proposed from recreational cannabis dispensaries to the perimeter of school grounds, a playground, a recreation center or facility, a child care center, a public park or public library, or a game arcade to which admission is not restricted to persons 21 years of age or older.

Staff notes that the following provisions are also being proposed at this time:

- Cannabis craft growers, cannabis infuser organizations, cannabis processing organizations, and cannabis transporting organizations as special uses in the I-2 General Industrial District as a special use.
- The prohibition of on-site consumption of cannabis as part of any permitted or conditional use.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 17 (ZONING) OF THE NORTH AURORA MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO ADULT-USE CANNABIS

WHEREAS, the Village of North Aurora, Illinois, has enacted municipal code regulations for the purpose of improving and protecting the public health, safety, comfort, convenience and general welfare of the people; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois enacted the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act (Act), which pertains to the possession, use, cultivation, transportation and dispensing of adult-use cannabis, which became effective June 25, 2019; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Village may enact reasonable zoning ordinances or resolutions not in conflict with the Act, regulating cannabis business establishments, including rules adopted governing the time, place, manner and number of cannabis business establishments, and minimum distance limitations between cannabis business establishments and locations the Village deems sensitive; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board initiated a text amendment to Title 17 of the North Aurora Municipal Code (Zoning Ordinance) to review and consider the regulation of adult-use cannabis facilities within the Village of North Aurora; and

WHEREAS, the North Aurora Plan Commission conducted public hearings, as required by law, on October 1, 2019 in regards to the proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance pertaining to adult-use cannabis; and

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission recommended approval of the proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance (a copy of which recommendation is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "A").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of North Aurora as follows:

SECTION 1: The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein.

SECTION 2: Section 16.3 (General Terms) of Chapter 16 (Definitions) of Title 17 (Zoning) of the North Aurora Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding the language as follows:

16.3 - General terms.

• • • •

Adult-Use Cannabis Business Establishment. An adult-use cannabis cultivation center, craft grower, processing organization, infuser organization, dispensing organization or transporting organization.

Adult-Use Cannabis Craft Grower. A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to cultivate, dry, cure and package cannabis and perform other necessary activities to make cannabis available for sale at a dispensing organization or use at a processing organization, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Cultivation Center. A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to cultivate, process, transport and perform necessary activities to provide cannabis and cannabis-infused products to licensed cannabis business establishments, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization. A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation to acquire cannabis from licensed cannabis business establishments for the purpose of selling or dispensing cannabis, cannabis-infused products, cannabis seeds, paraphernalia or related supplies to purchasers or to qualified registered medical cannabis patients and caregivers, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Infuser Organization or Infuser. A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to directly incorporate cannabis or cannabis concentrate into a product formulation to produce a cannabis-infused product, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Processing Organization or Processor. A facility operated by an organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to either extract constituent chemicals or compounds to produce cannabis concentrate or incorporate cannabis or cannabis concentrate into a product formulation to produce a cannabis product, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

Adult-Use Cannabis Transporting Organization or Transporter. An organization or business that is licensed by the Illinois Department of Agriculture to transport cannabis on behalf of a cannabis business establishment or a community college licensed under the Community College Cannabis Vocational Training Pilot Program, per the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, (P.A. 101-0027), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder.

11.2 - Use standards.

- G. Adult-Use Cannabis.
 - 1. Purpose and Applicability. It is the intent and purpose of this Section to provide regulations regarding the cultivation, processing and dispensing of adult-use cannabis occurring within the corporate limits of the Village. Such facilities shall comply with all regulations provided in the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act (P.A. 101-0027) (Act), as it may be amended from time-to-time, and regulations promulgated thereunder, and the regulations provided below. In the event that the Act is amended, the more restrictive of the state or local regulations shall apply.
 - 2. There shall be a maximum of one (1) Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization located in the Village of North Aurora.
 - 3. Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organizations shall be located a minimum of 1,000 feet from the property line of any school grounds, public playground, public recreation center, child care center, public park, public library, or game arcade to which admission is not restricted to persons 21 years of age or older located in the Village of North Aurora.
 - 4. On-site consumption of cannabis shall be prohibited.
 - 5. Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organizations shall be located a minimum of 1,500 feet from the property line of any pre-existing Adult-Use Cannabis Dispensing Organization located in the Village of North Aurora.

SECTION 5: Section 8.2 (Permitted and Special Uses) of Chapter 8 (Business Districts) of Title 17 (Zoning Ordinance) of the North Aurora Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding the following use in Table 8-1 as a Special Use in the B-1 Community Business District, B-2 General Commercial District and B-3 Central Business District and adding the applicable use standards:

RE:	Purchasing Policy Update – Misc. Surplus Property

When the Village purchases and replaces vehicles and equipment, an Ordinance declaring the old vehicles or equipment as "surplus property" is presented to the Village Board for approval as dictated by State Statute. At that time, the Village will either sell or dispose of the property in the manner deemed best by the Village Administrator of delegated staff.

Often times, staff will wind up with items that have little or no perceived value whatsoever. These could include old chairs, desks, extremely outdated information technology equipment, old furniture, damaged file cabinets, miscellaneous office equipment, etc.

In order to expeditiously and efficiently dispose or sell these items, staff has drafted language which would amend the Purchasing Policy to provide the Village Administrator with the authority to sell, dispose or give away such items that have an estimated value of \$500 or less. In the drafted language, staff also provides a method for the Village Administrator to donate or give away such items if it makes sense versus disposal, with preference being given first to charities, not-for-profits or other governmental units that may have some use for the items. A restriction is provided where no items could be given to any employee, elected or appointed official, or immediate family member of either.

Items which are above the estimated resale value of \$500 would still be declared surplus separately by the Village Board as is current practice. The Government Operations Committee discussed this on October 7th and recommended it be considered for Village Board approval.

Disposal of Surplus Property

The Village is required to comply with State statute 65 ILCS 5/11-76-4 which prescribes procedures to follow for the disposal of surplus property. The Village Administrator is responsible for ensuring that all requirements of this policy are met.

Any Department Head identifying surplus property should notify the Village Administrator or his/her designee that such property is no longer in the best interest of the Village to retain custody of.

- 1. The respective Department Head should provide:
 - a. Description of the item such as make, model, serial number, etc.
 - b. Date originally acquired and original acquisition cost, if any.
 - c. Proposed method of disposal i.e. auction, direct sell, trade-in, etc.
- 2. If the proposed method of disposition is a trade-in, the Village will have to notify all bidders that the item of a new or replacement item will be traded-in as part of the purchase price.
- 3. The Village Administrator or designee will then prepare an ordinance and related Exhibit for Village Board consideration which will declare the items as surplus property.
- 4. Upon approval by the Village Board the Village Administrator will direct staff to proceed with the disposition of the property.
- 5. Upon sale or disposition of the property the respective Department Head will notify the Finance Director that such sale or disposition has taken place and the amount of the sale price, if any.

If in the opinion of the Department Head a particular item has a potential resale value of less than five hundred dollars (\$500), the Village Administrator is authorized or may delegate staff to sell that item in the manner most expeditious and cost-effective, with or without advertising the sale, taking into account the cost of advertising and staff time and effort, without separate Village Board approval.

The Village Administrator may also authorize certain items to be disposed of, or recycled if the potential value of such item is minimal or negligible. The Village Administrator is also authorized to give away items to charities, not-for-profits or other governmental entities if it makes practical sense to do so. However, in no event shall any items be given away to any elected official, employee, appointed official or immediate family of those individuals. After any item has been sold, disposed, or donated the responsible Department Head will send details of the transaction, or action taken to dispose of the items, to the Finance Director.

At the September 15, 2019 Village Board meeting, the Village Board acted to reject the bid for the proposed Site & Electrical Work at Well 8 & 9. The Village only received one bid and that bid was significantly over budget. Initially the total project cost was estimated at \$1,704,345 and the bid received was \$1,988,475.

Staff worked with our consulting engineer to re-bid the project, and after some discussion, chose to divide the contract into two parts, the electrical work and the site work. The re-bid was a successful endeavor and the Village received two electrical bids. The estimate was in the amount of \$474,345 and the low bid was prepared by H Linden and Sons Sewer and Water, Inc in the amount of \$477,725. Combined with the low bid for the electrical work of \$1,144,848, the total project cost is \$1,622,573. By dividing the project into parts the Village realized a cost savings of \$365,902.

A detailed bid tabulation prepared by our consulting engineer is attached to this memorandum. Based on the favorable pricing received, it is the staff recommendation to award the contract for the Site Work for Well House 8 & 9 to the low bidder H Linden and Sons Sewer and Water, Inc. in the amount of \$477,725.

The Village is currently a member of the Southwest Fox Valley Cable Consortium (SWFVCC). The Village has been a member of SWFVCC since its inception in 2002. The SWFVCC currently provides the Village the option to video record municipal meetings and special events, a studio at Waubonsee College that residents can utilize, and an avenue to televise Village meetings on a cable PEG access channel for residents, local businesses and local organizations. The Village Board recently asked staff to research other similar options that could be more cost effective since technology has changed significantly since the consortium was established.

At the October 7th Committee of the Whole meeting, staff presented the three potential options to the Village Board regarding recording Village meetings and other aspects of public access information. The Village Board ultimately directed staff to initialize the process to leave the SWFVCC and have the Village record municipal meetings internally. The Village can choose to expand services at a later date should the Village Board choose to do so. This option also does not impact the Village's ability to post recorded meetings and videos on YouTube since this is already being done internally on the Village's YouTube page.

The attached resolution states that the Village will be terminating and withdrawing its membership at the end of the SWFVCC fiscal year (June 30, 2020) and will continue to make the required payments in the SWFVCC through June 30, 2020. Staff estimates these payments to the consortium as stated in their bylaws will cost \$40,000-\$60,000. This resolution also serves as the minimum 90 day written notice that the Village intends to leave the consortium. Upon the notice the remaining members of the consortium will have 90 days to determine whether the consortium should continue. Should the consortium dissolve, the Village is unsure it would receive any proportional share of remaining assets.

Attached is the resolution terminating membership in the Fox Valley Cable & Telecommunications Consortium effective June 30, 2020.

WHEREAS, the Village of North Aurora (the "Village") is a founding member of the Fox Valley Cable & Telecommunications Consortium (the "Consortium") and has been paying a percentage of the revenues collected from the cable and video providers operating in the Village over to the Consortium and utilizing the Consortium to provide local cable access stations, access to a studio at Waubonsee Community College and other benefits for North Aurora residents; and

WHEREAS, technology has changed dramatically since the establishment of the Consortium in the 1990's, fewer people use cable television technology, and many other platforms for similar services are available through other sources; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees believe that similar services can be provided, including the televising of the Village meetings, and other benefits provided by the Consortium through other means on a more cost-effective basis than the services provided through the Consortium; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees have determined that the best interests of the Village and of its citizens would be most effectively satisfied by terminating the Village's involvement with the Consortium, withdrawing from membership and ceasing to pay the proceeds over the Consortium that are collected from the cable and video providers in the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of North Aurora, Kane County, Illinois, as follows:

1. The recitals set forth above are adopted and incorporated herein as the material and significant findings of the President and the Board of Trustees as if fully stated herein.

2. The Village hereby exercises its right to terminate and to withdraw its membership in the Consortium effective at the end of the Consortium's current fiscal year, June 30, 2020.

3. The Village will continue to pay its proportional membership dues from cable provider revenue received by the Village through June 30, 2020.

4. The Village intends by this Resolution to provide more than the ninety (90) day notice that is required in the governing documents of the Consortium, to provide adequate notice to the other members and the staff of the Consortium and to continue to take advantage of the benefits of the Consortium through the end of the Consortium's fiscal year.

5. This Resolution shall take immediate force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

ITEM

Resolution approving Amendment No. 1 to the Intergovernmental Agreement between the Village of North Aurora and the County of Kane regarding jurisdictional transfer and access to Oak Street from Randall Road to Orchard Road.

DISCUSSION

Kane County officially transferred jurisdiction of Oak Street from Orchard Road to Randall Road in 2002 via an intergovernmental agreement. The intergovernmental agreement provided for seven access points along this portion of Oak Street, with no access allowed within 500 feet of Orchard Road. Since 2002, a majority of the access points have been constructed. The Village requested an amendment to the agreement to allow the right to approve access points at our own discretion. The proposed amendment would maintain Kane County's approval for modifications to two access points located within 1,000 feet of Orchard Road and release Kane County from any remaining access point reviews along Oak Street.

Staff notes that this is the first review of this item. The Kane County Board has already approved Amendment No. 1.

ORIGINAL

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF NORTH AURORA AND THE COUNTY OF KANE REGARDING JURISDICTIONAL TRANSFER AND ACCESS OAK STREET FROM RANDALL ROAD TO ORCHARD ROAD

This Agreement entered into this 10th day of September, 2002, by and between the COUNTY OF KANE (hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY), a body corporate and politic of the State of Illinois, and the VILLAGE OF NORTH AURORA (hereinafter referred to as the VILLAGE), a municipal corporation of the State of Illinois. WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the VILLAGE are considered governmental entities within the meaning of the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act as provided for in the Illinois Compiled Statutes 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. and are units of government within the meaning of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970 Article VII, Section 10; and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY owns, maintains and otherwise has exclusive jurisdiction over Kane County Highway No. 15 also known as Oak Street (hereinafter referred to as "Oak Street") in the Township of Aurora, County of Kane, State of Illinois; and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY desires to transfer, and the VILLAGE desires to accept and otherwise acquire exclusive jurisdiction over a portion of Oak Street pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Highway Code (605 ILCS 5/4-409 and 605 ILCS 5/5-105); and,

WHEREAS, the COUNTY is authorized pursuant to the Illinois Highway Code (605 ILCS 5/5-105) to transfer jurisdiction of a portion of Oak Street to the VILLAGE.

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COUNTY in order to facilitate and assure the proper flow of traffic on Oak Street both now and in the future, and to permit reasonable development of lands adjacent thereto, wish to limit direct access from properties adjoining Oak Street; and,

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COUNTY have determined that limitations as set forth below on direct access to Oak Street from Orchard Road to Randall Road are necessary for proper transportation planning and land use planning along Oak Street; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above captioned preambles and for other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is agreed to by the parties hereto, both the COUNTY and the VILLAGE mutually covenant, agree and bind themselves as follow, to wit:

1

- 1. Any and all preambles and recitals as are set forth above are incorporated herein and made part hereof, the same constituting the factual basis of this Agreement.
- 2. Both the COUNTY and the VILLAGE acknowledge and agree that this Agreement is for the transfer of complete and exclusive jurisdiction over a portion of Oak Street as described herein and is entered into by and between the parties pursuant to the Illinois Highway Code.
- 3. Both the COUNTY and the VILLAGE acknowledge and agree that the portion of Oak Street to be transferred from the COUNTY to the exclusive jurisdiction of the VILLAGE is approximately 1.1 miles in length and is more particularly described in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein. The limits of the jurisdictional transfer are: from the easternmost right of way line of Kane County Highway No. 83 also known as Orchard Road (hereinafter referred to as "Orchard Road") where Oak Street intersects with Orchard Road in Section 6 of Aurora Township in the County of Kane to the westernmost right of way line of Kane County Highway No. 34 also known as Randall Road (hereinafter referred to as "Randall Road") where Oak Street intersects with Randall Road in Section 5 of Aurora Township in the County of Kane as is generally depicted on Exhibit "A", said transferred portion of Oak Street (hereinafter referred to as "TRANSFERRED OAK STREET").
- 4. Said transfer of exclusive jurisdiction of TRANSFERRED OAK STREET from the COUNTY to the VILLAGE shall include any and all rights of the COUNTY to all highway right of way whether in fee simple or by dedication or easement and further includes any and all appurtenances associated therewith relative to the public's use thereof as a highway.
- 5. The VILLAGE has, prior to entering into this Agreement, examined TRANSFERRED OAK STREET and knows the condition thereof and has received the same in good condition and repair.
- 6. Upon execution hereof by both parties and upon subsequent approval by the Illinois Department of Transportation, the COUNTY shall surrender and otherwise relinquish any and all jurisdiction that it may have over TRANSFERRED OAK STREET.
- Upon execution hereof by both parties and upon subsequent approval by the Illinois Department of Transportation, the VILLAGE shall accept complete and exclusive jurisdiction over TRANSFERRED OAK STREET, except as otherwise provided herein.
- 8. The COUNTY shall prepare any and all documents as may be required by the Illinois Department of Transportation to accomplish the transfer of jurisdiction as set forth herein. Said documents shall be executed where necessary by the VILLAGE at the request of the COUNTY and shall be forwarded by the COUNTY to the Illinois Department of Transportation.

- 9. The VILLAGE shall, (i) accept jurisdiction of TRANSFERRED OAK STREET and (ii) neither the VILLAGE nor his successors and assigns shall at any time vacate any portion of TRANSFERRED OAK STREET without the prior written consent of the County Engineer of Kane County. In consideration thereof the COUNTY shall pay to the VILLAGE the amount of one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) and shall continue snow removal of TRANSFERRED OAK STREET for a period of 5 years from the effective date of this agreement.
- 10. This Agreement shall become effective upon the execution hereof by the parties hereto.
- 11. The VILLAGE and the COUNTY agree that access to TRANSFERRED OAK STREET shall be only as provided herein and in no case shall access be perimitted within five hundred feet (500') of Orchard or Randall Roads. Access for all of the real estate adjacent to TRANSFERRED OAK STREET shall be designed using good engineering principles, and be in substantial conformance with Exhibit "B" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein and more particularly described as:
 - A. FUTURE RIGHT IN/RIGHT OUT. Future right-in/right-out on the north and south side of Oak Street approximately five hundred feet (500') east of the centerline of Orchard Road.
 - B. HANSEN. Future full access approximately nine hundred feet (900') east of the centerline of Orchard Road.
 - C. FUTURE FULL. Future full access approximately one thousand four hundred feet (1400') east of the centerline of Orchard Road.
 - D. FOREST RIDGE DRIVE. Existing full access approximately two thousand two hundred eighty feet (2280') east of the centerline of Orchard Road. This access may be upgraded in the future to include a south leg.
 - E. WHITE OAK DRIVE. Existing full access approximately two thousand four hundred sixty feet (2460') west of the centerline of Randall Road.
 - F. VICTORIA CIRCLE. Existing full access approximately one thousand one hundred thirty feet (1130') west of the westernmost right of way line of Randall Road. This access may be upgraded in the future to include a north leg.
 - G. FUTURE FULL. Future full access approximately six hundred fifteen feet (615') west of the centerline of Randall Road. This access point must serve the property at the northwest corner of Randall Road and Oak Street. The VILLAGE and COUNTY agree to coordinate with adjacent property owners/developers to provide internal connecting roadways that will facilitate this shared access. This access will also serve the property on the southwest corner of Randall Road and Oak Street.
- 12. This Agreement may be amended only in writing upon the signatures of all the parties hereto.

- 13. This Agreement is executed and submitted by the VILLAGE as of the date set forth below. A duplicate original of this Contract, duly executed by the VILLAGE, shall be delivered to the COUNTY not later than 5 business days from such date.
- 14. The parties hereto acknowledge and agree that in the event that any section, paragraph, subdivision or sentence of this Agreement shall be for any reason held invalid or to be unconstitutional, such decision holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Agreement.



AMENDMENT NO 1 TO THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF NORTH AURORA AND THE COUNTY OF KANE REGARDING JURISDICTIONAL TRANSFER AND ACCESS TO OAK STREET FROM RANDALL ROAD TO ORCHARD ROAD

This Amendment No 1 to the Intergovernmental Agreement Between the Village of North Aurora and the County of Kane Regarding Jurisdictional Transfer and Access to Oak Street from Randall Road to Orchard Road, hereinafter referred to as "Amendment No 1" entered into this ______ day of October 2019, by and between the COUNTY OF KANE (hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY), a body corporate and politic of the State of Illinois, and the VILLAGE OF NORTH AURORA (hereinafter referred to as the VILLAGE), a municipal corporation of the State of Illinois. The COUNTY and the VILLAGE are sometimes hereinafter individually referred to as a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and the VILLAGE are considered governmental entities within the meaning of the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act as provided for in the Illinois Compiled Statutes 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. and are units of government within the meaning of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, 1970 Article VII, Section 10; and

WHEREAS, the VILLAGE and the COUNTY previously entered into an Agreement dated September 10, 2002 titled Intergovernmental Agreement Between the Village of North Aurora and the County of Kane Regarding Jurisdictional Transfer and Access to Oak Street from Randall Road to Orchard Road, hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Agreement the County, among other things, transferred to the Village exclusive jurisdiction of a segment of Oak Street from Orchard Road to Randall Road as described in the Agreement (hereinafter TRANSFERRED OAK STREET"), and which Agreement also regulated access points along the jurisdictionally transferred segment Oak Street; and

- 1. The preambles and recitals as are set forth above are incorporated herein and made part hereof, the same constituting the factual basis of this Amendment No. 1
- 2. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the transfer of complete and exclusive jurisdiction to the VILLAGE of Transferred Oak Street as described in the Agreement has been completed and approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation on January 10, 2003 pursuant to the terms of the Agreement.
- 3. The VILLAGE and the COUNTY acknowledge and agree that the respective obligations of the Parties as set forth in Paragraphs 3 through 10 of the Agreement have been met to the satisfaction of the Parties and that said paragraphs (3 through 10) are therefore deleted from the Agreement in their entirety.
- 4. The VILLAGE and the COUNTY acknowledge and agree that provisions of Paragraph 11 of the Agreement are deleted in their entirety and replaced with the following language:

The VILLAGE and the COUNTY agree that the location of any access point (whether ingress or egress) on TRANSFERRED OAK STREET shall in no case be permitted within five hundred feet (500') of Orchard Road. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the term "access point" means "the geographic location along a highway where motor vehicle ingress to and egress from a property immediately adjoining the highway is allowed regardless the manner or means of ingress or egress". The Parties further agree that no additional access points other than those described in this paragraph as set forth herein below shall be permitted within one thousand feet (1000') of Orchard Road. Access points for all of the real estate adjacent to TRANSFERRED OAK STREET shall be located and designed using good and sound highway engineering principles that foster the safe and efficient movement of motorized and pedestrian traffic. Both the VILLAGE and the COUNTY agree that the COUNTY retains and shall have the right of review and final approval over and veto of any access points on TRANSFERRED OAK STREET within 1,000 feet of Orchard Road including the access points on TRANSFERRED OAK STREET described as follows:

A. EXISTING RIGHT IN/RIGHT OUT. The existing right in/right out on the north and south sides of Oak Street approximately five hundred feet (500') east of the centerline of Orchard Road.

B. HANSEN ROAD. Existing full access approximately nine hundred feet (900') east of the centerline of Orchard Road.

- 5. Exhibits "A" and "B" of the Agreement are deleted in their entirety.
- 6. This Amendment No. 1 shall become effective upon execution of the Parties.
- 7. This Amendment No. 1 may be amended only in writing upon the signatures of all the Parties.
- 8. This Amendment No. 1 is executed and submitted by the VILLAGE as of the date set forth below. A duplicate original of this Amendment, executed by the VILLAGE and duly attested to by its clerk, shall be delivered to the COUNTY not later than 5 business days from such date.
- 9. The Parties acknowledge and agree that in the event that any section, paragraph, subdivision or sentence of this Amendment No. 1 shall be for any reason held invalid or to be unconstitutional, such decision holding shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Amendment.

	Purchase

The Village purchases salt through the State's Joint Purchasing Program, which leverages the purchasing power of many municipalities and counties throughout the state. In March the Village submitted the amount of salt it would like to order to the State to be included in their bid process. This year the low bid was \$96.25 per ton, which is much higher than staff had estimated.

The Village had budgeted \$216,000 for salt purchase out of the MFT fund in fiscal year 2019-2020. This was based on past three years' average unit price of \$59.21 combined with an escalator. The table below displays past and current unit prices for salt, tons ordered, as well as the total cost of past years' programs and the estimated cost of this year's program. The Village has requested 2,500 tons of salt in the amount of \$240,625. Based on this number we have the ability to request another 20% if we have a bad winter. The cost, if this option were exercised, would increase to \$288,750.

In order to expend MFT funds the Village prepares a resolution outlining all the maintenance activities for the year. Salt purchase is included in this resolution. Typically staff estimates this number higher than the actual cost of all maintenance activities. However the number was not high enough to account for a 64% price increase. In order to fund salt purchase from the MFT fund, we need to pass a supplemental resolution that is reviewed and approved by IDOT. Staff is recommending passing the supplemental resolution to purchase salt in the amount of an additional \$70,000. This would allow staff to purchase up to 3000 tons of salt, if necessary, at the current unit price. This would increase the total resolution

including all maintenance operations from \$650,000 to \$720,000. Sufficient funds exist in our MFT fund to cover this additional expenditure.
