

WHEREAS, the Village previously approved a mixed-use planned unit development consisting of residential apartments and commercial out lots known as The Springs at Orchard located at 1801 Oak Street, North Aurora, IL (the "Property") for which Letter of Credit #OSB.009558 was posted by Huntington Bank (the "Letter of Credit") as surety for the completion and payment of the public improvements associated with the Property (the "Public Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Village of North Aurora acknowledged the substantial completion of the Public Improvements associated with the residential portion of the Property by Resolution #R18-06-18-01 dated June 18, 2018, and reduction of the Letter of Credit to the one-year maintenance amount, and the one-year maintenance requirement began from and after that date; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has completed and satisfied all of the one-year maintenance obligations for the Public Improvements as acknowledge by the Village Engineer and has requested release of the Letter of Credit and acceptance of the Public Improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has not yet granted all the easements necessary for the public utilities and other purposes as required.

NOW, THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of North Aurora, as follows:

- 1. Recital set forth above and incorporated herein as the material findings of fact of the President and the Board of Trustees.
- 2. The Village hereby acknowledges the completion of the one-year maintenance period for the Public Improvements on the Property, agrees to the reduction and release of the Letter of Credit agrees to accept the Public Improvements pursuant to a completed and executed Bill of Sale in the form attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit "1" ("Bill of Sale"), but the acceptance of the Public Improvements is conditioned on the complete transfer all required easements to the Village and/or public utilities as required. Until all the easements are provided and recorded in acceptable form to the Village the Public Improvements shall not be deemed accepted, and the Developer shall remain primarily responsible for ongoing maintenance and liability for the Public Improvements in keeping with all relevant codes and requirements.
- 3. This Resolution shall take immediate force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law, the Letter of Credit is released, and the Public Improvements shall be considered accepted from and after the tender of an executed Bill of Sale.

As in previous years, the annual North Aurora Days firework display launch site will be from the property located at the southwest corner of Oak Street and Randall Road. A license agreement between the Village and Randall Oaks LLC is needed for the use of their property to conduct the firework display. This year's fireworks display will take place on Saturday, August 8th. Should there be a rain out, the fireworks display would take place on Sunday, August 9th.

Please find attached a license agreement with Randall Oaks LLC, to allow the Village permission to use the property at the southwest corner of Oak Street and Randall Road for this year's North Aurora Days fireworks display.

LICENSE AGREEMENT TO OPERATE EVENT

This Agreement is made effective as of ______, by and between RandallOaks LLC, an Illinois limited liability company (hereinafter "Licensor"), and the Village of North Aurora, an Illinois municipal corporation (hereinafter "Licensee").

In consideration of the mutual covenants, agreements, and stipulations contained in this agreement, the parties agree as follows:

I. LICENSE

The Licensor grants to the Licensee the non-exclusive right and privilege for the term specified below of a portion of the property located at the southwest corner of Randall Road and Oak Street in the Village of North Aurora (hereinafter "Property") for the purpose of staging and firing off fireworks in conjunction with the North Aurora Days festival.

II. OPERATION

- A. The Licensee shall not allow any activities at the Property except for activities authorized by this Agreement, all of which shall be overseen by the Licensee according to the terms of this Agreement.
- B. The Licensee shall conduct activities at the Property beginning on August 8, 2020, and continuing through August 8, 2020, during the North Aurora Days festival to stage and display fireworks (hereinafter "North Aurora Days"). The rain date is set for August 9, 2020. The Licensee shall only allow Licensee's employees, agents and volunteers to access the Property who are authorized for purposes of staging and preparing for the fireworks display, conducting the fireworks display and cleaning the Property. Authorized parties shall include employees, agents and volunteers of the Licensee and the North Aurora Fire District and employees and agents of the private entity that has been engaged by the Licensee to conduct the fireworks display.

- A. The Licensee shall use that area of the Property that is furthest from improvements on the property and adjacent properties and the public roads, as directed by the Fire District.

The Licensee shall keep the Property and surrounding area in a clean, sanitary, and orderly condition. The Property shall be kept clean. All trash and litter shall be cleaned up after the fireworks display is finished, and the Property shall be returned to its original condition. The Licensee will repair any damage to the Property, including any damage to roads, curb and stormwater systems.

VII. NORTH AURORA DAYS FIREWORKS DISPLAY

- A. The Licensee shall have the right to use the Property for the staging and conduct of the North Aurora Days fireworks display at the times specified herein.
- B. The Licensee shall have the right to contract with third parties to oversee the staging and operation of the fireworks display, including the North Aurora Fire Protection District, providing that the Licensee shall be solely responsible for the contractual obligations to the third parties and shall be responsible to the Licensor for the conduct the third parties and observance of the terms of this Agreement. The Licensor shall not be liable or responsible, in any way, for any debts or liabilities contracted by the Licensee.

Prior to opening for business, certificates of insurance must be presented to the Licensor demonstrating that the Licensee has obtained the necessary insurance coverage for the 2020 North Aurora Days.

XI. LICENSES, AND PERMITS

The Licensee shall obtain or cause its invitees to obtain all required licenses and permits required for operation of the North Aurora Days Activities prior to the beginning of North Aurora Days.

XII. EMPLOYEES' WAGES AND BENEFITS

The Licensee agrees to assume exclusive liability for the payment of all wages and any sums imposed by federal, state, and local authorities on its employees or others, for or relating to unemployment insurance, pensions and retirement benefits, health or life insurance, or the social security of employees or other persons who perform work or services for the Licensee.

XIII. LOSS OR PARTIAL LOSS OF BUILDING

If the Property is rendered untenantable by fire or other casualty, and the Licensor cannot or chooses not to place the Property in a suitable condition for business purposes because of the extensive damage by fire or other casualty, this agreement shall terminate.

Over the last three July 3rd fireworks celebrations (2017, 2018, and 2019), the Village Board has allowed liquor in North Aurora Riverfront Park for the event. Staff is seeking direction from the board on whether or not to allow liquor in the park during the event for 2020. Should the Village Board choose to allow liquor In North Aurora Riverfront Park, the Village can allow bring your own beer/ bottle (BYOB) as an option by passing a resolution stating that an event is sponsored by the Village.

In past years, staff has had concerns that the event will attract a large crowd which may cause difficulty in keeping liquor in the permitted area. However, signage and police officers have been used in the past which have helped mitigate safety concerns. If approved again for 2020's event, staff will continue to have signage in the park designating where liquor is allowed. Staff also plans to have police officers attend the event as an additional safety measure. 2020's Independence Day Fireworks celebration will be on July 3, 2020 from 6:00 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. with a rain date scheduled for July 4, 2020.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL LICENSE AGREEMENT FOR FIREWORKS ON FOX VALLEY PARK DISTRICT PARK DISTRICT PROPERTY

This Agreement is made effective as of Month 9, 2020, by and between The Fox Valley Park District (hereinafter "Park District"), and the Village of North Aurora (hereinafter "Village").

Should the Village Board choose to allow liquor In North Aurora Riverfront Park, the Village can allow bring your own beer/ bottle (BYOB) as an option by passing a resolution stating that an event is sponsored by the Village.

In past years, staff has had concerns that the event will attract a large crowd which may cause difficulty in keeping liquor in the permitted area. However, signage and police officers have been used in the past which have helped mitigate safety concerns. If approved again for 2020's event, staff will continue to have signage in the park designating where liquor is allowed. Staff also plans to have police officers attend the event as an additional safety measure. 2020's Independence Day Fireworks celebration will be on July 3, 2020 from 6:00 p.m. to 10:30 p.m. with a rain date scheduled for July 4, 2020.

Attached is a special events permit application for use of North Aurora Riverfront Park from the Village for the Independence Day Fireworks Celebration. Also attached is a resolution designating the celebration as a Village sponsored event where BYOB will be allowed for the event.

WHEREAS, the Village of North Aurora would like to host their Independence Day Firework Celebration in North Aurora Riverfront Park on July 3, 2020 from 6:00p.m. to 10:30 p.m. with a rain date scheduled for July 4, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Village of North Aurora has indicated that they would like patrons attending the Independence Day Firework Celebration to have the ability to be able to bring their own liquor in North Aurora Riverfront Park for consumption on premises; and

WHEREAS, the Village approved an ordinance that allows the sale, possession and/or consumption of liquor on Village property under certain conditions and circumstances in North Aurora Riverfront Park for Village sponsored events/series of events; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of North Aurora as follows:

- Section 1. The Independence Day Firework Celebration taking place in North Aurora Riverfront Park on July 3, 2020 is designated as a Village sponsored event.
- Section 2. Liquor shall be allowed to be brought into North Aurora Riverfront Park for consumption during the hours of the event in keeping with the following conditions and limitations:
- A. Liquor must be transported to the Park in compliance with local and state laws pertaining to the transportation of liquor in unopened containers;
- B. No open containers of liquor may be removed from or possessed or consumed outside the Park, defined as the area from spillway to the east, the bike path north of State Street and the bike path east of the River (excluding the bike path) and the area running

parallel to the northern end of the Village Hall to the bike path, and includes all of the area interior to those boundaries, including the Gazebo and water features.

- C. Staff are hereby directed to place appropriate signage around the perimeter of the area, designating the areas beyond which open containers of liquor are not allowed.
- D. Liquor may only be removed from the area in sealed containers in keeping with local and state law.
- E. Only persons age 21 or older may possess of consume alcohol in the Park, and persons bringing alcohol into the Park shall be responsible to ensure that it is not consumed or in the possession of anyone who is age 20 or younger.

Section 3. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take immediate effect from and after its approval.

Sealing in the amount \$78,226.00

Crack sealing is an important part of pavement maintenance. This operation is generally performed on streets that are showing light wear. The purpose of the crack sealing program is to prevent water from infiltrating the base and sub-base of the pavement where it can weaken the overall structure of the pavement. In the winter time this prevents water from freezing and expanding, causing the pavement to heave or crack. Crack sealing is most effective in extending pavement life when its age is between two and four years old however, there are benefits to sealing older streets as well. This year the project plans and specifications and letting was prepared and conducted by staff. Engineering Enterprises, Inc. will provide the construction management services. The streets selected for crack sealing this year are displayed in the table below.

The following Special Provisions supplement the "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction", Adopted April 1, 2016 , the latest edition of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", and the "Manual of Test Procedures of Materials" in effect on the date of invitation of bids, and the Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions indicated on the Check Sheet included here in which apply to and govern the construction of 20-00000-02-GM , and in case of conflict with any part, or parts, of said Specifications, the said Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

This proposed project consists of routing, cleaning, and filling cracks in asphalt pavement in multiple locations within the corporate boundaries of the Village of North Aurora. Locations are identified in the exhibits contained within these contract documents. Locations will be priortized by the Village. The project is completed when the planned quantity of crack filling material is exhausted or all streets have been crack filled.

PROSECUTION OF THE WORK

Work shall be completed in accordance Section 108 Prosecution and Progress. Article 108.03. of this Section shall be modified to require to contractor to provide 48 hours notice prior to the intial start of work.

PROGRESS AND STREET SCHEDULE

The progress schedule shall be prepared in accordance with Section 108 Prosecution and Progress. Article 108.02. of this Section shall be modified to indicate the Progress Schedule should be provided to the Engineer on the Bureau of Construction form BC 255 or approved alternate Gantt chart approved by the Engineer.

PARTIAL PAYMENTS AND ACCEPTANCE AND FINAL PAYMENT

Partial and Final Payments shall be prepared in accordance with Section 109 Measurement and Payment. Article 109.07 Partial Payments and Article 109.08 Acceptance and Final Payment shall be modified to indicate lien waivers must be submitted to the Village of North Aurora at the time a partial or final pay request is submitted.

JOB SITE MAINTENANCE AND CLEAN-UP

The work site must be kept clean and orderly. Debris shall be collected and disposed of as the slow moving operation progresses. All hazardous materials must be secured or removed from the job site at the end of each day. Crackfiller that has been tracked to adjacent streets must be cleaned of the pavement by the end of each work day. The contractor shall have the ability to sweep and vacuum all debris created by the operation at a frequency determined by the Engineer as dictated by operations. The sweeping will be required no more than at the end of each day. This includes the sweeping and vacuuming of excess fine sand, portland cement, or mineal filler used to prevent tracking.

All Cost associated with JOB SITE MAINTENANCE AND CLEAN-UP shall be considered incidental to the contract.

CRACKFILLING

Crack Sealing or Crack Filling shall be completed in accordance with Section 451 Cracksealing Hot-Mix Asphalt Pavement.

Article 451.04 General. Paragraph 2 shall be modified to indicate that cracks that have a width greater that 3/4" shall be routed by along each edge of the crack. In Paragraph 3 the minimum ambient air temperature shall be increased to 45 degrees Farenheit. In Paragraph 5 the dimension of the "band-aid" shall be changed from "approximately 2 in." to "between 2 and 3 inches in width centered over the crack with the overband thickness of approximately 1/8 inch" This paragraph shall be modified to indicate that no over-banding of existing or recently placed crackfiller will be allowed. In paragraph 6 the second sentence

shall be modified to: "When conditions warrant and as directed by the Engineer, the sealant may be dusted with fine sand, portland cement, or mineral filler to prevent tracking."

This work will be paid for at the contract unit price per foot for CRACK ROUTING and per pound for CRACK FILLING.

TRAFFIC CONTROL PLAN

This work shall be completed in accordance with Sections 701 and 702 of the Standard Specifications and following traffic standards: STANDARD 701301-04, STANDARD 701306-04, STANDARD 701426-09, STANDARD 701427-05, STANDARD 701701-10, STANDARD 701901-08 and LRS 3 & LRS 4 in the Local Roads and Streets Recurring Special Provisions

All costs associated with the TRAFFIC CONTROL PLAN shall be considered incidental to the contract.

INSURANCE

The Bureau of Local Roads and Streets Special Provision for Insurance shall be modified to require a copy of the certificate of insurance to be provided to the Village of North Aurora.

COMPLETION DATE

The work shall be completed by May 31, 2020. This date is based on the Village receiving proposals and awarding a contract on March 16, 2020. In event that all work is not completed by this date then the contractor will be liable to pay the Village of North Aurora liquidated damages in the amount of \$475 per calendar day as set forth in the Standard Specifications Article 108.09 Failure to Complete Work on Time. The liquidated damages shall accrue and be assessed until all work is complete.

ELECTRICIANS AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN (NORTH) - Townships of Burlington, Campton, Dundee, Elgin, Hampshire, Plato, Rutland, St. Charles (except the West half of Sec. 26, all of Secs. 27, 33, and 34, South half of Sec. 28, West half of Sec. 35), Virgil and Valley View CCC and Elgin Mental Health Center.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars

including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Construction, installation, maintenance and removal of telecommunication facilities (voice, sound, data and video), telephone, security systems, fire alarm systems that are a component of a multiplex system and share a common cable, and data inside wire, interconnect, terminal equipment, central offices, PABX and equipment, micro waves, V-SAT, bypass, CATV, WAN (wide area network), LAN (local area networks), and ISDN (integrated system digital network), pulling of wire in raceways, but not the installation of raceways.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all material that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installation of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and exteriors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and exterior which are installed in a similar manner.

MATERIAL TESTER I: Hand coring and drilling for testing of materials; field inspection of uncured concrete and asphalt.

TRAFFIC SAFETY - Effective November 30, 2018, the description of the traffic safety worker trade in this County is as follows: Work associated with barricades, horses and drums used to reduce lane usage on highway work, the installation and removal of temporary, non-temporary or permanent lane, pavement or roadway markings, and the installation and removal of temporary road signs.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION Class 1. Two or three Axle Trucks. A-frame Truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks and tractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry-alls; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Oil Distributors 2-man operation; Pavement Breakers; Pole Trailer, up to 40 feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-propelled Chip Spreader; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Truck Conveyor Operation, 2 or 3 man; Teamsters; Unskilled Dumpman; and Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, barricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Class 2. Four axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnapulls or Turnatrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yards; Ready-mix Plant Hopper Operator, and Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 3. Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by

hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

MATERIAL TESTER & MATERIAL TESTER/INSPECTOR | AND ||

Notwithstanding the difference in the classification title, the classification entitled "Material Tester I" involves the same job duties as the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector I". Likewise, the classification entitled "Material Tester/Inspector II".
