Halloween is coming up and suggested **trick-or-treat** hours are from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. on Monday, October 31. I encourage all of our residents to practice safety so that everyone may have a safe and fun Halloween. Children should trick-or-treat with adult supervision and everyone should use crosswalks and look both ways while traveling. Motorists should be extra careful driving through neighborhoods. Later on, candy and treats should be inspected by adults before they are eaten. Have a scarily good Halloween!

Free Leaf Disposal

There are two options for disposal of leaves. Residents may bag their leaves in Kraft paper bags and Groot will pick up leaf-filled Kraft paper bags **FREE** on your service day during October and November. Residents may also choose to rake leaves to the curb for the Village's free curbside leaf pick-up.

The Village's free leaf pick-up program will run from mid-October through late November based on the schedule below:

- Residents on the **WEST** side of the River, pick-up will begin on Mondays the weeks of: **Oct. 17, Oct. 31 and Nov. 14**
- Residents on the **EAST** side of the River, pick-up will begin on Mondays the weeks of: **Oct. 24, Nov. 7 and Nov. 21**

Leaves **must be raked to the parkway along the curb by 6 a.m. Monday** of the pick-up week. Leaf piles should be less than 2 feet in height, must be free of foreign materials (branches, plants, rocks and landscape waste) and raked in a row parallel to the street, at least 1 foot and no more than 5 feet back from the curb.

Leaves **MUST be out by 6 a.m. on Monday** of the pick-up week with leaves being picked up at any time during the entire week. The Village keeps a log of streets that have been serviced and the leaf-vactor truck will not go down streets a second time, once they have been serviced that week. If leaves are not raked to the curb by Monday, 6 a.m. of the pick-up week, residents will have to wait for their next scheduled pick-up week or bag the leaves for pick-up.

Residents are encouraged to park in driveways or garages during this operation, to allow better access for the leaf collection equipment. **Please keep leaves away from mailboxes, ditches, pipes and culverts.** Please note that snow, rain, below freezing temperatures or mechanical difficulties may delay or halt the curbside leaf collection program.

Yard waste (other than leaves) require stickers and will also be picked up through November. After November yard waste will not be picked up until April.

Cross Connection Control Program Mandatory Survey Reminder

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requires that all water systems in the State of Illinois have an effective Cross Connection Control Program. Cross connections within the public water supply are a serious concern, as they can allow contaminants or pollutants to enter the public water system through what is called "backflow." One necessary component in this program is to survey North Aurora's water system to determine where cross connections exist. Trash pick-up will **not** be delayed due to Columbus Day **OR** Thanksgiving.

Mailboxes

During the winter, unstable mailboxes and deteriorating wood posts are more likely to be damaged from heavy snow coming off the snow plows. Residents are reminded that they are responsible for the maintenance and proper installation of their mailbox and post. Residents should ensure the post and mailbox is sturdy and can withstand the pressure of snow coming off the snow plow. Village contractors and crews do their best to avoid hitting mailboxes, however, due to poor visibility, a mailbox or post may accidentally be damaged by the snow plow.

If damage is done by a snow plow, residents should call the Village as soon as possible so the Village can assess the damage and provide a temporary mailbox. Residents will be reimbursed up to \$100 for the replacement and installation of the new mailbox. Please note, the Village will only provide reimbursement to a mailbox or post that has been hit directly by a snow-plow blade or some portion of the plow truck and will not be liable for mailboxes damaged by the force of the snow that comes off the plow. If there is no evidence, then the mailbox and/or post will be their responsibility.

Can You Believe Fall Is Here? Let's Take a Look at Some Fall Maintenance Tasks

Fall is the perfect time to take care of the little things that can make a big difference for you and your home. Code Enforcement has put together a quick checklist as a guide to assist you with some common later season issues.



- Store or cover outdoor furniture and grills.
- Caulk joints and minor cracks on exterior walls and siding.
- Look for deteriorating finishes. Minor problems can be patched to preserve the wood.
- Drain and shut off sprinkler systems and other exterior water lines to avoid frozen and broken pipes.
- Insulate exterior spigots and other pipes that are subject to freezing but cannot be drained or shut off
- Make sure that hoses are removed from all spigots.
- Clean storm drains, gutters and other drain pipes.
- Inspect or have someone inspect the roof for loose, damaged or missing pieces.
- Check attic vent openings for nests or other blockages.
