1. Approval of Ordinance Approving the 1st Budget Amendment for Fiscal Year 2023-24

Director Paprocki reminded the Board that the item had been discussed at the previous Committee of the Whole meeting. The item was in regard to the restructuring of the Public Works department, specifically reclassifying the Village Engineer position to the Assistant Public Works Director/Village Engineer, it authorized the Foreman position and de-authorize the Street Superintendent position. This adjustment resulted in no change of head count and the result on the budget was a decrease in salary and benefits of the Public Works Department by \$78,530.

Motion for approval made by Trustee Lowery and seconded by Trustee Curtis. **Roll Call Vote:** Trustee Lowery – yes, Trustee Niedzwiedz – yes, Trustee Salazar – yes, Trustee Christiansen – yes, Trustee Curtis –yes, Trustee Guethle – yes. **Motion approved (6-0).**

2. Approval of Resolution Authorizing Contract Purchase of Electricity for Street Lighting Through the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative (NIMEC) Bid Process

This item was a Resolution to give the Village Administrator authority to sign an electricity rate agreement for street lights should the bids be favorable to the Village. Paprocki stated that the Village

had been part of the Northern Illinois Municipal Electric Collaborative for over ten years. The NIMEC bids electricity rates for the Village. Paprocki informed the Board that the Village had received the bids earlier in the evening and if, upon review, the rates are favorable compared to the current floating ComEd rate for the street lights, and the Village could then choose to enter into an agreement.

Motion for approval made by Trustee Guethle and seconded by Trustee Salazar. **Roll Call Vote:** Trustee Guethle – yes, Trustee Lowery – yes, Trustee Niedzwiedz – yes, Trustee Salazar – yes, Trustee Christiansen – yes, Trustee Curtis –yes. **Motion approved (6-0).**

VILLAGE PRESIDENT – Mayor Gaffino spoke about the first Village kite flying event. He stated that the event was a success. Trustee Guethle stated that the event had been front page news in the Beacon. Mayor Gaffino also spoke about the Fox Valley Park District’s canoe race that traveled down the Fox River through North Aurora.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Gaffino called the meeting to order.

ROLL CALL

DISCUSSION

1. Special Event Code

Administrator Bosco explained that on occasion the Village Staff reviews the Municipal Code for any regulations that may be outdated or are no longer practical. He stated that the Board was going to be discussing suggested updates to Outdoor Special Event Permits. Bosco stated that the discussion would be focused on aspects of the Code that have been challenging from an administrative perspective, which were time and parking.

Bosco said that there are times that the Staff need to make discretionary decisions regarding the time and parking requirements within the Code.

Currently, the Code stated that a Special Event Permit was required when:

- The use of any Village property is requested
- The closure of any public street or blocking of any parking on public streets
- The use of any commercial parking lot that reduces the number of required parking spaces
- The use of mobile food vendors:
 - More than one vendor in a day
 - More than one vendor at a time
 - More than two hours at a time on any property, unless catering a private event
- The sale of alcoholic liquor
- Any event at which sound amplification will be used:
 - Sunday through Thursday before 10:00 am and/or after 9:00 pm; or
 - Friday and Saturday before 10:00 am and/or after 10:00 pm

Bosco explained the difference between a Special Event Liquor License which can be obtained by a civic groups, charitable organization, and government entities which the Mayor can sign off on. A Special Use Liquor License can be obtained by a business who does not normally sell liquor but would like to utilize a business that has a valid Illinois State Retail Liquor License to sell liquor at an event. The Special Use Liquor License currently must go before the Village Board before the Mayor can sign off on the License.

The difficulty with this is that if the business applies too late for the item to be on a Board Meeting agenda, they cannot have their event.

There was discussion regarding the sound amplification portion of the code, however no changes were discussed.

The discussion turned to the parking space requirements for businesses and the nuance that makes the requirement challenging. Bosco stated that the challenge with the parking requirement comes up often. He suggested adding a provision to the Code stating that if after internal review, the event as planned is deemed to create an adverse effect on parking it will require a permit.

In regard to food trucks, the suggestion was to remove the food truck portion from the Outdoor Special Event Permits because there is a section of the Municipal Code dedicated to Mobile Food Vendors which encompasses all of the provisions required by the Special Event Permit.

The Staff created two lists regarding the approval process for Outdoor Special Event Permits. Each list suggested who they thought should have the authority to approve the permits.

- **Village Board Approval**

- The closure of any public street, posting of “no parking” signs on public streets or blocking of any parking on public streets
- Any event at Which sound amplification equipment will be used:
 - Sunday through Thursday before 10:00 am and/or after 9:00 pm; or
 - Friday and Saturday before 10:00 am and/or after 10:00 pm

*The ability to serve alcohol outside would still be required per code

- **Village Administrator Approval**

- The use of any Village property in a manner other than its intended use
- Any event held on a non-residential property consisting of more than one tenant where:
 - The use of drive aisles would be used for purposes other than vehicle access
 - Parking spaces needed to accommodate special event guests at a proportional rate that would impact the amount of available parking for adjacent tenants

In summary, the Staff was suggesting to remove the food truck provisions from the permit process, make the parking requirements more of a discretionary review by Staff, Liquor License goes directly to the mayor and everything else goes to the Village Board for approval.

The Village Board was in agreement, however Trustee Lowery expressed his unease in giving authority to future Village Administrators. Attorney Drendel stated that the Village Board is the governing body and can delegate discretion to Staff with parameters. There was discussion regarding this, ultimately the Village Board was in agreement with the suggested changes.

RE: Public Works Mechanic

As part of a restructuring plan for the Public Works department, staff has approached the International Union of Operating Engineers Local 150 regarding the creation of a Mechanic position. Currently, one of the Public Works Laborers performs in-house service on Village vehicles when practical. Given the timing of a recent Public Works restructure, staff felt the timing was best to address this now.

The Mechanic pay range falls between the Crew Leader and Foreman ranges. The Mechanic starting pay is \$67,569 and top of range is \$90,854. For reference the current range for the Laborer position is \$53,934 to \$74,942. This change would transfer one Public Works Laborer position to the Mechanic position, resulting in no headcount increase. The Mechanic would still be on call and perform other department wide extraneous duties, such as snow plowing, special event setup, and assistance on water main breaks.

The estimated increase to the FY 2023-24 budget related to this position reclassification is \$3,930 in salary and benefits the first year. Although the Mechanic position increases the FY 2023-24 budget, the previously approved Public Works restructure (which reclassified the Village Engineer to Assistant Public Works Director/Village Engineer, deauthorized the Streets Superintendent position, and authorized the Foreman position) resulted in a \$78,530 budget decrease.

Staff is seeking approval of the attached Memorandum of Agreement with Local 150 to add the Mechanic position. In addition, a copy of the job description is included.

**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
REGARDING ADDITION OF CLASSIFICATION OF MECHANIC**

The Village of North Aurora (“VONA” or the “Employer”) and The International Union of Operating Engineers Local 150, Public Employees Division (“Union”), collectively referred to as the “Parties”, agree to the following:

1. The VONA and the Union are Parties to a collective bargaining agreement (“CBA”) covering employees of the Employer.
2. In the CBA, Article I Section 1.1, Recognition, lists the employees covered by the CBA.
3. In the CBA, Article XXIII Section 23.1, Wage Rates, sets the rates for the employees covered by the CBA.
4. Pursuant to and in accordance with Article 1 Section 2, New Classifications, the VONA proposed, and the Union agreed, to add the classification of Mechanic to the bargaining unit with the following wage scale:

5. Section 14.4, Certification Incentive of the Collective Bargaining Agreement, does not apply for all mechanic certifications required by the VONA, or any additional mechanic-related licenses obtained by the Mechanic. The Mechanic position is eligible for the certification incentive for additional non-mechanic certifications reasonably determined by the VONA to be reasonably beneficial to the operations of the Department.
6. The VONA agrees to execute an agreed Unit Clarification Petition, upon presentment by the Union, accreting the title “Mechanic” in the Union. The Parties agree that the job functions of Mechanic are similar to those of other Union positions, and that the title is properly accreted to the Union.
7. Pursuant to the Parties’ discussions, all eligible employees may apply for the new Mechanic position and if hired, the employee will be placed on the next step that represents a pay increase from their current step.
8. This Agreement will be considered non-precedent setting and will not be relied upon by the Parties to form the basis of any past practice argument.

Re: Purchase of a New 2026 International HV607 Plow and Hook Lift System Truck

The Public Works Department is seeking approval to purchase a new five-yard snowplow truck with a hook lift system. The purchase of a new vehicle was budgeted in the 2023-2024 fiscal year from the Vehicle and Equipment Fund in the amount of \$350,000.00.

The vehicle that Public Works is requesting is a 2026 International HV607 equipped with a Swap Loader Hook Lift System, a v-box salt spreader, an 11' snowplow, and a 1065-gallon anti-icing system. The primary use for this vehicle will be to remove snow and spread salt in the winter during snow and ice removal operations. Also, to pretreat the roads with a salt brine solution. However, the truck is a versatile asset that will be used year-round. With the addition of the hook lift system this truck will be able to utilize several other attachments that we already own including a flatbed used to haul salt for the water department, a leaf collection box, and our woodchipper box. This versatile truck can be converted for five different jobs tasks in one day unlike a standard dump truck. We currently have two trucks in our fleet that are similar to this truck.

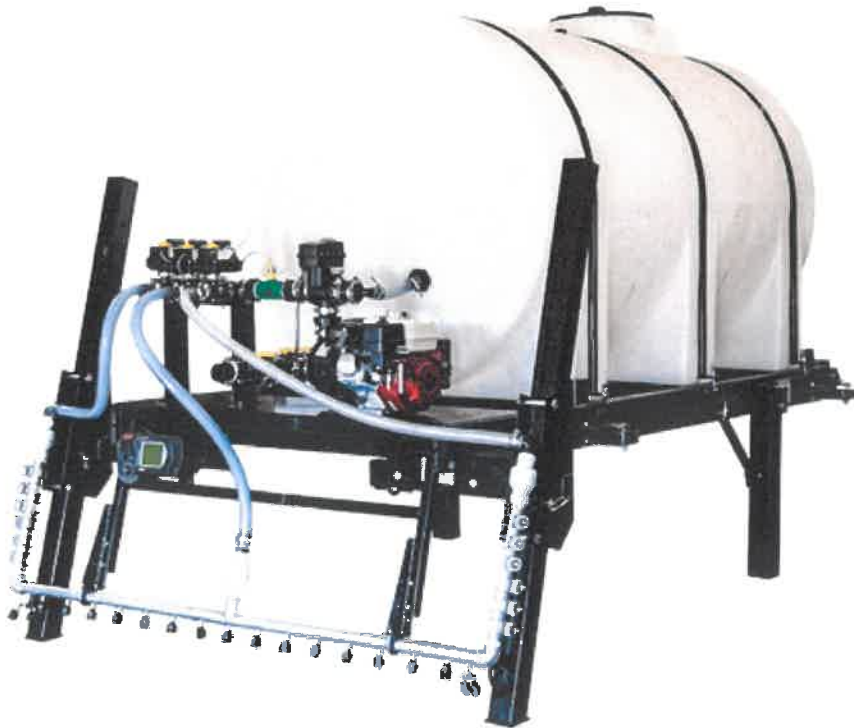
This truck will be a new addition to our fleet. With the hiring of a new streets laborer we are in need of an additional truck to optimize the operations of the public works department. This will allow us to save money and depend less on the contractor when it comes to snow removal. Ultimately, we are working towards having all our main snowplow routes done by village employees.

Currently there are nine trucks in the fleet that perform these operations, one of the trucks will operate as a backup vehicle for snowplowing operations. The table below identifies each of the vehicles used in our snowplowing operations.

Supply chain issues are still causing long delays when it comes to taking delivery of ordered vehicles. Freightliner is not accepting build dates for their trucks currently. International is accepting orders however the delivery of our truck will take place in 2025-26. It appears that the supply chain issues, and lack of build dates will continue into the next several years. This means that it could take several years before a truck can even be delivered after the signing of the contract.

The base cost of the International HV607 truck is \$114,962.00 from Rush Truck Center. The cost of the snow and ice equipment needed to outfit the truck is \$203,197.00 from Monroe Truck Equipment. The total cost for the truck and equipment is \$318,159.00. Unfortunately, there may be some fluctuation in the purchase price of this truck as the cost of the truck and equipment will increase before the delivery of the truck. We took this into consideration when we came up with the budget numbers for this purchase. The purchase of the truck and the equipment upfitting will be through the Sourcewell purchasing program. We have used this cooperative purchasing program for the purchase of several vehicles in the past. The details of the snow and ice equipment as well as the base cost for the truck is attached to the document for reference.

The amount budgeted for the purchase of this vehicle is \$350,000. The purchase price of this vehicle is \$31,841.00 under the budgeted amount. At this time the Public Works Department is requesting the purchase of the International HV607 snowplow truck with the Swap Loader System and anti-icing spray unit for a total amount of \$318,159.00 with a not to exceed the amount of \$350,000.00 to account for any fluctuation in pricing from Monroe Truck Equipment/Rush Truck Center.

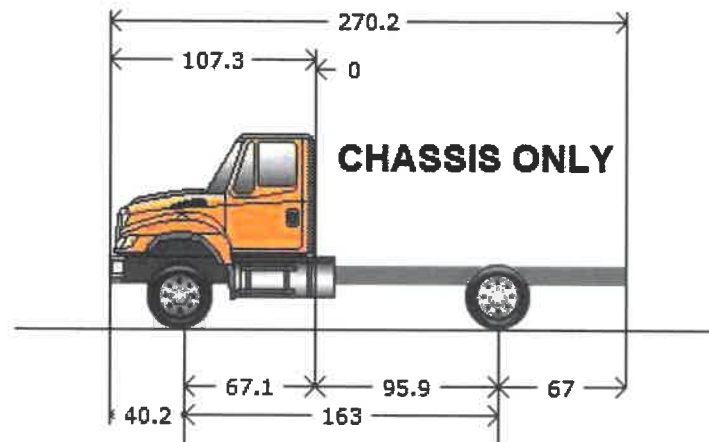

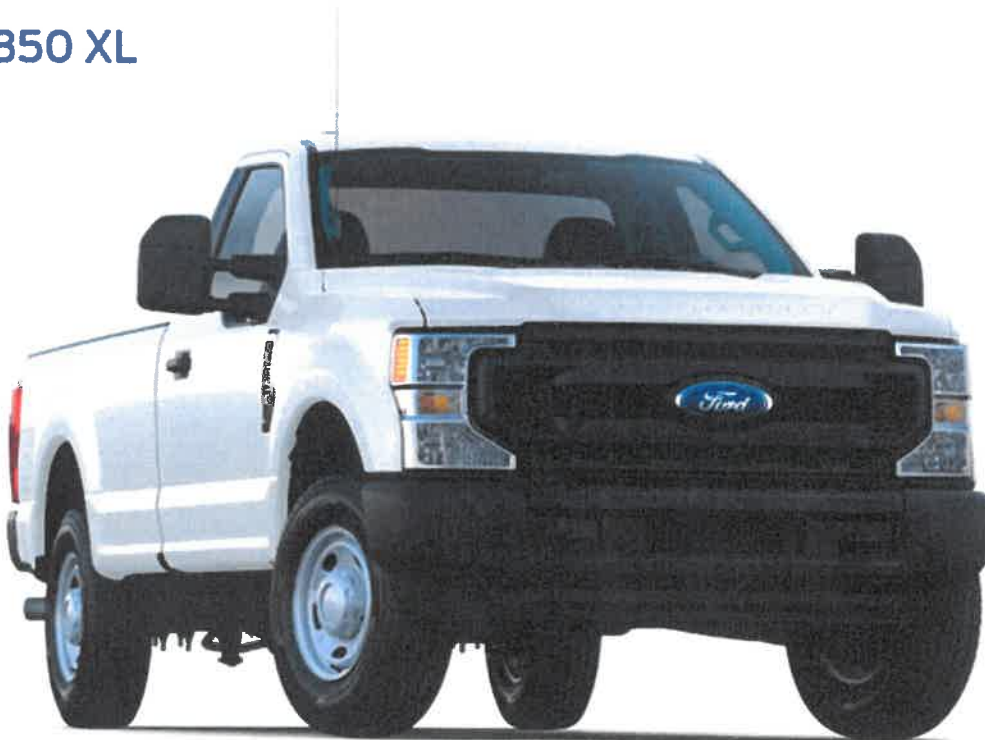

Re: Purchase of a New Public Works Vehicle

The Public Works Department is seeking to purchase a new Ford F-350 service truck for use by the Streets Division that is in the approved budget for the current fiscal year. This truck is going to be used for day-to-day operations and is necessary because we currently have two trucks dedicated to the streets division for these types of operations and eight staff members utilizing them. The typical use of this truck will be to transport tools and equipment to and from job sites including sidewalk and basins repairs, hauling a trailer carrying lawn mowing equipment, and traffic control and transportation of staff and materials to and from special events. In the future, seasonally, it will be included in snow removal operations.

As you may recall from the purchase of the most recent Water Division Service Trucks and Village Engineer truck, it has been challenging to acquire new vehicles. Supply chain issues have substantially increased delivery time. Both the municipal and State purchasing programs are unable to fulfill our orders currently due to industry supply issues. For example, we budgeted for the purchase of a Ford F-350 in the 2022-23 fiscal year. It was approved by the Village Board back in April of 2022. The Truck was later ordered in December 2022, this eight-month delay was because Ford was not taking new orders at that time and we currently still do not have a delivery or build date for this vehicle.

As market conditions for vehicles evolve, staff continues to try to balance its procurement strategy to identify the most cost-effective vehicle, while also trying to minimize the delivery delays. Ordering through a joint purchasing program is the desired method of procurement because it has traditionally been cheaper and offers the ability to have the truck built to specification. However, delays in delivery and vehicle availability have diminished its reliability and forced the Village to consider other options. As a result, the Village Board granted staff approval, in the past, to search for reasonably price vehicles that could be sourced at dealerships. Staff reached out to local dealerships and currently they had no vehicles that fit our needs or budgeted amount. Research was done on the internet and staff was able to locate a 2022 Ford F-350 Super Duty at Bredemann Ford in Glenview. Staff contacted the dealership and was able work with the Commercial/Fleet Account Manager to get a sales quote for the purchase of the truck. He informed staff that they have sold several vehicles to other municipalities in the area. The dealership has another Ford F-350 Super Duty that matches our needs. Staff discussed if we should cancel the truck that was ordered back in December and purchase the second truck from the dealership. Staff reached out to National Auto Fleet Group to check on the previous ordered and they still are unable to provide us with a delivery date for the truck. Staff can cancel the order of this truck at any time.

The amount budgeted for the combination of the two trucks is \$107,910.00. Staff is recommending that we cancel the purchase the truck with National Auto Fleet Group and purchase two 2022 Ford F-350 Super Duty trucks from Bredeman Ford in the amount of \$110,820.52. This is \$2,910.52 over the budgeted amount however there are funds in the Vehicle Replacement fund to cover the difference. Attached you will find the sales quotes and the vehicle information sticker.

The subject property is currently improved with a multi-use commercial strip center that includes an auto repair shop and three separate office tenant spaces. District 129 would utilize the entire building for a vocational automotive training center. The northern portion that currently houses the auto repair shop would accommodate lab activities where vehicles would be used as a demonstration and practice opportunities. The three office spaces to the south would house and offer diagnostics, hybrid, and engine lab environments. In the future, District 129 may consider utilizing the three offices spaces for other classes such as HVAC and Fire Science. An Educational Facility, Vocational School is classified as a special use in the B-2 District.

Staff solicited feedback from the Village Board on the proposed special use at the May 15, 2023, Committee of the Whole meeting. The Village Board was very supportive of the use and only concern going forward was regarding the potential loss in tax revenue for the site.

A public hearing was held on this petition at the June 6, 2023, Plan Commission meeting. The Plan Commission was comfortable with the use of the property but did discuss the School District's use of signage and the plans for the building façade, primarily the types of colors used to paint the façade (if painted). The Plan Commission unanimously recommended approval of Petition 23-02, subject to the condition that staff review the business district design standards pertaining to the color of the building finishing, should the School District decide to paint the exterior façade.

Hours of Operation

The anticipated hours of operation for the automotive programming vocational school would be 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Parking

The Educational Facility, Vocational School use requires 1 off-street parking space per 10 students (based on maximum enrollment) + 2 spaces per classroom. According to the petitioner, the facility would include 40-45 students on campus at any one time along with 1 to 2 staff members on site. As such, the Zoning Ordinance would require a total of 13 parking spaces. The subject property currently provides a total of forty-eight (48) parking spaces. District 129 has mentioned that most of the students will be bussed to the site.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff finds that the information presented meets the Standards for Specials Uses as submitted by the petitioner and the Use Standards regulating Educational Facility, Vocational School as set forth in the Zoning Ordinance. Based on the above considerations, staff recommends approval of Petition #23-02.

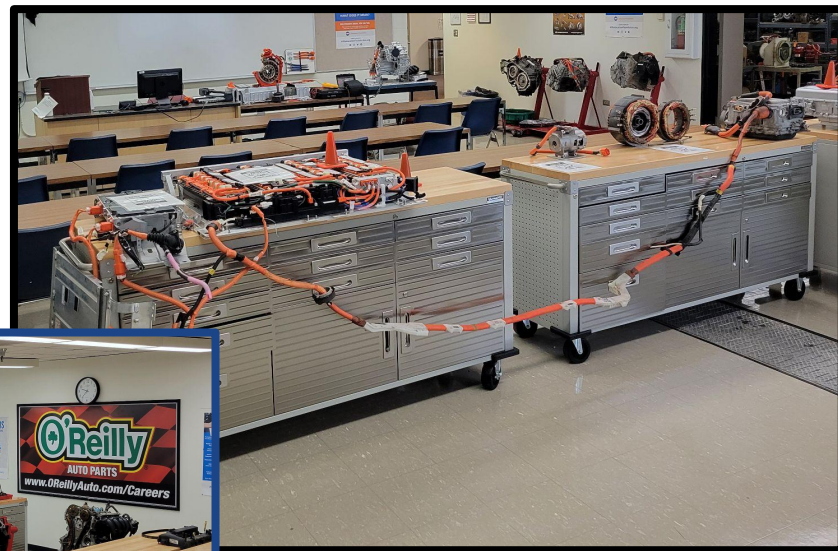

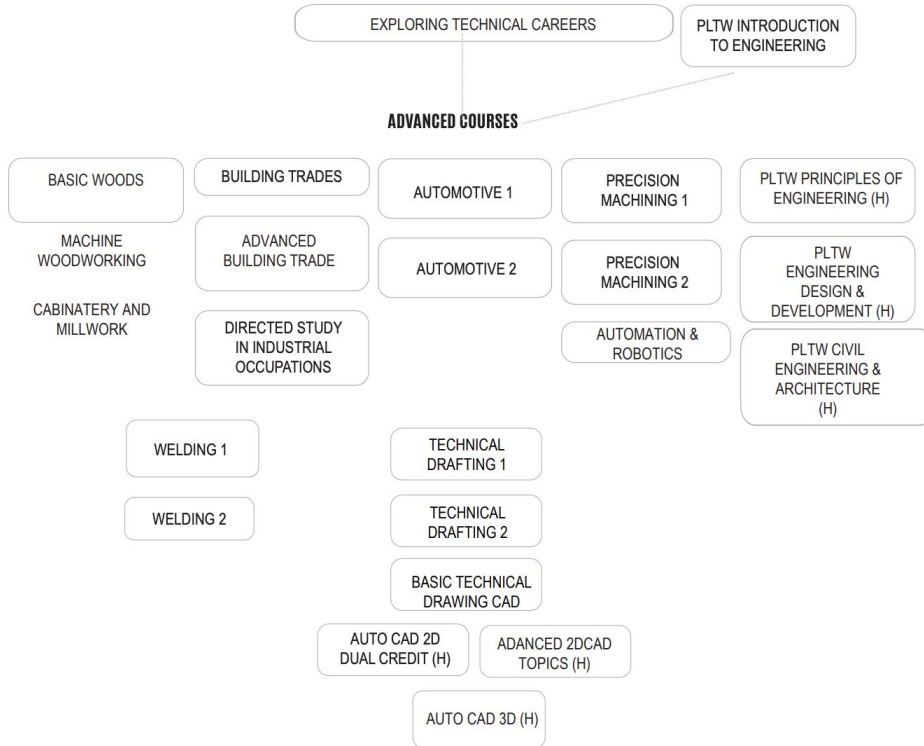

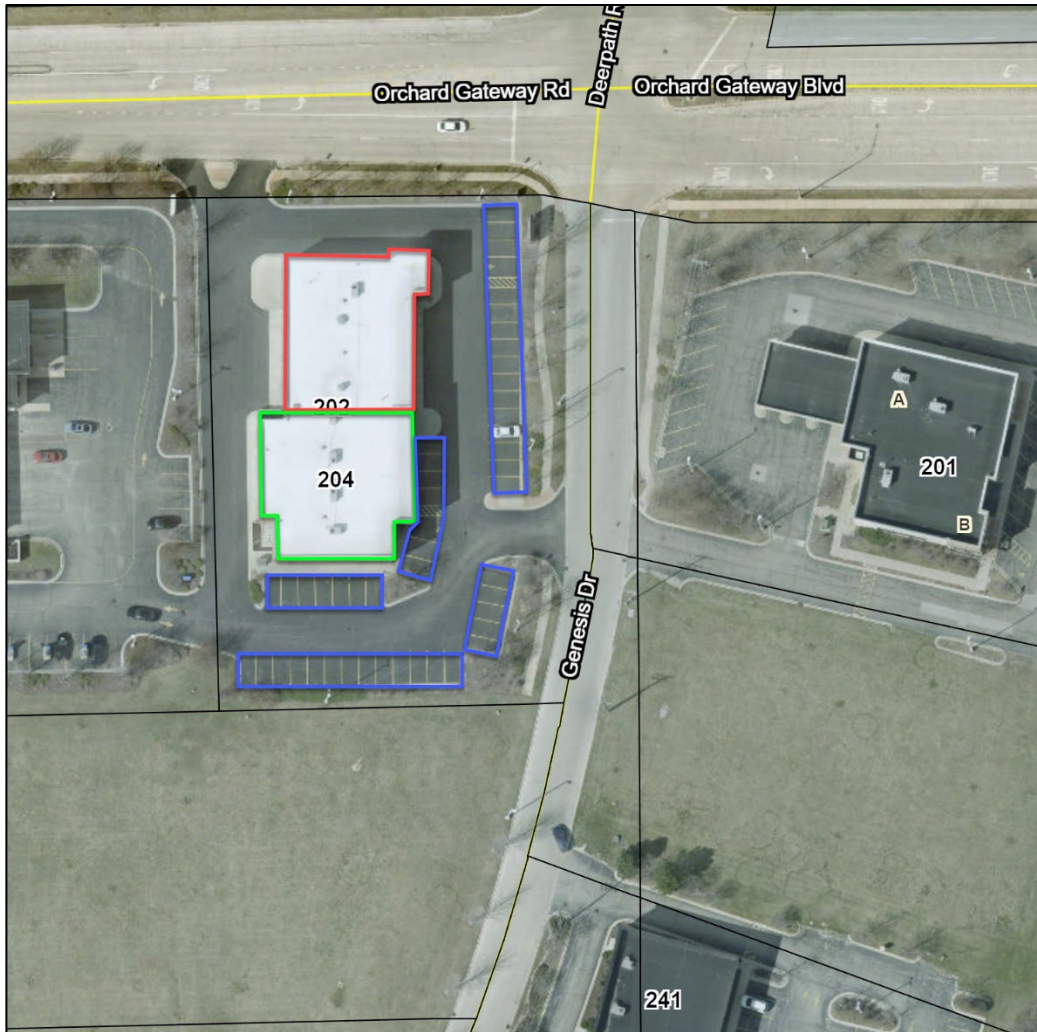

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VOCATIONAL SCHOOL IN THE B-2 GENERAL BUSINESS DISTRICT FOR THE
PROPERTY LOCATED AT 202 GENESIS DRIVE, NORTH AURORA, ILLINOIS**

(Petition #23-02; 202 Genesis Drive)

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of North Aurora have heretofore adopted the North Aurora Zoning Ordinance, otherwise known as Title 17 of the Code of North Aurora, Illinois (the “Code”); and,

WHEREAS, an application has been filed requesting approval of a special use pursuant to Title 17, Chapter 8 of the North Aurora Zoning Ordinance to allow for an Educational Facility, Vocational School for the property located at 202 Genesis Drive, North Aurora, Illinois (the “Property”) in the B-2 General Business District; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing on the forgoing application was conducted by the Village of North Aurora Plan Commission on June 6, 2023, pursuant legal notice as required by State law and the Code; and,

WHEREAS, the Plan Commission has filed its recommendations with the President and Board of Trustees recommending approval of the special use described herein; and,

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees determine that the findings and recommendations of the Plan Commission are reasonable and appropriate and that the approval of the requested special use for the Subject Property is consistent with the criteria for special use approval and is in the best interest of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of North Aurora, Kane County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: The recitals set forth above are incorporated in this Ordinance as material finding of the President and the Board of Trustees.

SECTION 2: The application for special use for an Educational Facility, Vocational School is hereby approved for the Property, subject to the following condition:

1. If the School District decides to paint the exterior façade, the School District must submit the proposal for review by Village staff in keeping with the business district design standards pertaining to the color of the building finishing.
