FALL CLEAN-UP: BULK ITEMS PICKED UP FOR FREE

The Village's annual Fall Clean-Up where all non-hazardous BULK items will be picked up for FREE will be happening the week of September 11-13 on your <u>regularly scheduled garbage day</u>. Your Fall Clean-Up Day will be:

- Monday, September 11: Households west of Randall Road
- Tuesday, September 12: Households east of Randall Road and west of the Fox River
- Wednesday, September 13: Households east of the Fox River

Stickers are required for all regular household garbage and yard waste, which will be picked up on the same day as the clean-up schedule. Please have items out by 6 a.m. as Groot will run extra trucks causing pickup times to change. As always, electronics are NOT considered bulk items. To schedule a separate pick-up for electronics, please contact Groot at (630) 892-9294.

Reminder on Fire Pits and Open Burning

Please keep in mind the Village's policy on fire pits and open burning during these pleasant summer evenings.

Open burning, which includes bonfires, is strictly prohibited. The burning of materials including refuse and garbage, yard waste (which includes leaves), processed materials and processed woods are not allowed.

The Village welcomes residents to use enclosed burning devices, like a fire pit, and gently reminds that no fires, even contained ones, should be left unattended.

Village of North Aurora Watering Restrictions

Residents are reminded of the Village's watering restrictions, which allows for automatic watering and lawn sprinkling from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. limited to the following:

All properties with even-numbered street addresses may water on even-numbered days of the month; and all properties with odd-numbered street addresses may water on odd-numbered days of the month. The Village of North Aurora's watering restrictions are in place as a continual water conservation measure within the Village.

Residents can use hand-held watering devices at any time. Watering restrictions are solely for automatic watering and sprinkling systems.

Increased Traffic During School Year

With school starting in just a few weeks, children will be walking to school, crossing streets and waiting at bus stops. Remember, student safety begins with roadway safety. Please be sure to obey the speed limit and watch for children in crosswalks. Drivers must always stop when a school bus is stopped to pick up or drop off students on a two-lane roadway. The bus driver will flash the lights on the front and rear of the bus and the stop signal arm will be extended. Remain stopped until the lights and stop signal are turned off.

Help Reduce Storm Water Pollution

Water pollution prevention and control measures are critical to improving our water quality and reducing the need for costly wastewater and drinking water treatment. Water pollution can come from storm water runoff which occurs when precipitation from rain or snowmelt flows over driveways, sidewalks and streets, which prevents the runoff from soaking into the ground. Storm water runoff can pick up debris, chemicals, dirt and other pollutants and flow into the storm sewer system and then into our rivers, ponds, and wetlands. When water becomes polluted, the effects can be far reaching including creating unsafe drinking water.

Residents can help prevent storm water pollution by taking action and following the pollution prevention tips below:

- Keep litter, pet waste, leaves and debris out of street gutters and storm drains.
- Apply lawn and garden chemicals sparingly and according to directions.
- Dispose of used oil, antifreeze, paints and other household chemicals properly-not in storm sewers or drains.
- Clean up spilled brake fluid, oil, grease and antifreeze. Do not hose them into the street and gutters.
- Control soil erosion on your property by planting ground cover and stabilizing erosion-prone areas.
- Have septic systems inspected and pumped, at a minimum every three to five years, so that it operates properly.
