

As we enter this autumn season that sees our town's scenery change from bright summer greens to crisp and refreshing reds and golds, I would like to highlight some exciting changes that are on the horizon for a very special place in North Aurora: Our Veterans Memorial.

The Village of North Aurora Veterans Memorial is located on Willow Way at Farview Drive and was originally built in 2007. It features items including a fountain, a curved stone wall, inscribed bricks and a plaque honoring all those from North Aurora who gave the ultimate sacrifice for our country. I am looking to expand and enhance the Veterans Memorial to create a further, even more beautiful and peaceful space, for our community to gather to honor our veterans. I have begun this process by establishing a committee comprised of veterans, residents, and Village staff to provide feedback and insight to these expansions that are being overseen by a landscape architect and look forward to sharing those plans in the future. During this time, the memorial brick program is still active and you can find details for such on the Village website.

The Veterans Memorial is where we host our annual Veterans Day Ceremony, which this year will take place on Monday, November 11, 2024, at 11:00 am. I invite the community to join me as we honor our veterans and thank them for their service. Following the ceremony, coffee and refreshments will be available at the North Aurora Police Department. I look forward to seeing everyone there and at other events throughout the community!

FREE Leaf Disposal Options and Information

Option One - Paper Bags: Residents may bag their leaves in paper lawn bags and Groot will pick them up for FREE on their service day during October and November. Yard waste (other than leaves) requires stickers and will also be picked up through November. After November yard waste will not be picked up until April.

Option Two - Leaf Vactor: Residents may rake leaves to the curb for the Village's free curb-side leaf pick-up. The Village's leaf vactor program will run based on the schedule below and starts each week on Mondays. The Village changes which side of town the leaf vactor will start on each year.

- Residents on the WEST side of the river: October 21, November 4 and November 18
- Residents on the EAST side of the river: October 28, November 11 and November 25

Leaves MUST be out by 6 a.m. on Monday during the pick-up week with leaves being picked up at any time throughout the entire week. Leaf piles should be less than 2' in height, free of foreign materials (branches, plants, rocks, and landscape waste) and raked in a row parallel to the street, at least 1' and no more than 5' back from the curb. Residents are encouraged to park in driveways or garages during this operation, to allow better access for the leaf collection equipment. Please keep leaves away from parked cars, garbage cans, mailboxes, ditches, streetlights, and fire hydrants.

The Village keeps a log of streets that have been serviced and the leaf-vactor truck will not go down streets a second time. If leaves are not raked to the curb by Monday, 6:00 a.m. of your pick-up week, residents will either have to wait for their next scheduled pick-up week or bag the leaves for pick-up. Snow, rain, below freezing temperatures or mechanical difficulties may delay or halt curbside leaf collection.

Police News Alert! Alert! CodeRED Replaces Nixle Emergency Alert System

The Village has recently enhanced our emergency alert system by switching from Nixle to OnSolve CodeRED to provide more effective notifications during emergencies such as water boil advisories, gas leaks, missing persons, road closures, and other urgent, time-sensitive situations. Registering for this free service is a simple yet crucial step to ensure your family stays informed and prepared for any local emergencies.

Our alerts can be community-wide or location-based, targeting only residents in the affected areas. You can customize the types of alerts you wish to receive, ranging from general community

information to critical emergency alerts.

Register for Government 101 - FREE Local Government Education Program

Government 101 is an educational opportunity for residents to learn more about how the Village of North Aurora operates.

The two-class program will feature aspects of how village government is structured and will include topics on each department: Administration, Community Development, Finance, Police, and Public Works!

Government 101 is a <u>two-part class</u> meeting from 6:30 – 8:30 pm on Tuesday, December 10 and Tuesday, December 17. The first class will take place at Village Hall, 25 East State Street, and the second class will take place at the North Aurora Police Department, 200 South Lincolnway.

New Public Works Facility - The Village's new Public Works facility is in the works! The Village approved more than two dozen bid packages — which includes everything from demolition of existing structures on the property to roofing to electrical work to fencing — in August that allowed construction to begin starting in September. The new Public Works Facility, seen in the rendered drawing to the right, is expected to be completed by early 2026. It will be adjacent to the current facility at 314 Butterfield Road.

Ride Along with these Bicycle Safety Tips

Did you know the North Aurora Police Department has a Bicycle Patrol Unit? Being on bikes allows officers to respond quickly to areas such as the Fox River Trail during events and allows maneuverability through a crowd as well.



Bicycle safety is crucial for everyone, whether you're commuting, exercising, or just enjoying a ride. Always wear a properly fitting helmet to protect your head in case of a fall. Make sure your bike is in good

condition by regularly checking the brakes, tires, and chain. Wear bright or reflective clothing to increase your visibility, especially at night or in low-light conditions. Follow traffic rules, ride with the flow of traffic, and use hand signals to indicate your turns and stops. Plan your route, stay alert and be aware of your surroundings to anticipate any potential hazards, such as fallen branches, animal crossings or pedestrians. Additionally, be sure to record the serial number on your bike in case it goes missing.

To prevent bicycle theft, always lock your bike with a sturdy U -lock or heavy-duty chain/cable, securing both the frame and wheels to a fixed object. Park your bike in well-lit, busy areas and avoid leaving it unattended for long periods. Consider removing accessories like lights or saddlebags when parking.

By following these tips, you can safely enjoy the stunning fall scenery along the Fox River Trail and other paths around North Aurora. Happy cycling!

Public Works News

Holiday Garbage Pickup - Pick-ups will **not** be delayed due to Columbus Day or Thanksgiving.

Mailboxes - During the winter unstable mailboxes and deteriorating wood posts are more likely to be damaged from heavy snow coming off the snow plows. Residents are reminded that they are responsible for the maintenance and proper installation of their mailbox and post. If damage is done by a snow plow, residents should call the Village as soon as possible so the Village can assess the damage, provide a temporary mailbox and reimbursement of up to \$100 if qualified.



The Most Wonderful Time of the Year

A holly jolly holiday season is upon us and we're kicking it off with the annual **Making Spirits Bright** event! Please join us on **Saturday, December 7** at North Aurora Riverfront Park for a festival full of holiday and community spirit!
